Anyone placing or restoring implants must be prepared for the possibility of potential complications.




































































































































































#### Are Isolated Teeth At Risk?

- · Isolated tooth distal to edentulous space is not at risk.
- · Majority of such teeth are not lost if missing teeth not replaced
- · Survival rate when missing teeth replaced or not by FPD, is significantly better than with RPD restoration (Quality of RPD design is important)




### When to consider RPD Treatment?

- Tooth loss is creating more partially edentulous patients.
- · Cost of implants & treatment time needed, precludes this therapy for most patients.
- Probably less than 5% of all partially edentulous patients will be restored with implant therapy

- · RPDs and oral health:
- -Perceived compromise of the remaining teeth not supported by the evidence.
- -No evidence of destruction of the periodontium of remaining teeth.
- -Most important factors are patient compliance and close follow up.


- · Patient satisfaction
